PUBLIC HEARINGS PENDING IN CITY COUNCIL MEETING

On January 2nd at 6:00pm the City Council will hold three (3) public hearings. The first is for the 2012-13 budget which has been available for public viewing since Dec. 19th. They will also hold a public hearing for projects which may be funded by the CDBG (Community Development Block Grant) program and the other is for projects which may be funded by the CIB (Community Impact Board). The public is invited to comment.
